## Our Digital Learning Plan Updated 2021

### 1. Introduction

This document records the outcomes of our current digital learning plan, including targets and the actions we will implement to meet the targets.

NOTE: Any parts of this document that are written in this format were written pre the COVID-19 pandemic. *Any sections of the document that are written in this format were written in 2021 after the school community had undergone two lockdowns and partaken in distance learning.*

### 1.2 School Vision:

- To promote a philosophy of education in which no child is considered an outsider; which promotes the fullest development of ability irrespective of gender, class or stereotype; and which encapsulates this ethos in a democratic partnership uniquely combining the involvement of parents with the professional role of teachers.

### 1.3 Brief account of the use of digital technologies in the school to date:

- *Prior to March 2021 our school used digital technologies everyday within the school building. Every class teacher and SET teacher had a school laptop. In addition, every mainstream and special class had an interactive whiteboard within the classroom. We had a number of digital technologies for students within the school too. The school was awarded the title of Digital School of Distinction in 2015. In the past 2/3 years more equipment for*

*digital learning has been purchased for specific classes. For instance, infant classes were using the Beebots during Aistear. Middle classes were beginning to use Lego WeDo. There was also a large purchase of class iPads at the beginning of the 2019/2020 school year along with a large charging trolley. It was envisioned for every mainstream class to have use of the school iPads and charging trolley for a week during the year. Classes would be allotted a slot by a timetable.*

- *Since we began this Digital Learning Framework the school and community has changed drastically due to COVID-19. Lockdowns forced the school building to close twice for long periods (March 2020-June 2020 and January 2021-March 2021). As a result the amount of online teaching and use of digital technologies increased enormously. Every class, child and teacher now has a Seesaw account and the school uses Zoom for online meetings and live teaching if and when required. We want the Digital Learning Framework to now reflect the rapid change in Digital Technologies as we continue to navigate through the pandemic.*

## **2. The focus of this Digital Learning Plan**

We undertook a digital learning evaluation in our school during the period (November 2019) to (March 2020). We evaluated our progress using the following sources of evidence:

- Parents' Focus Group
- 6<sup>th</sup> Class Students Focus Group

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### 2.3. These are a summary of our strengths with regards digital learning

- There are many Digital Technology resources within the school. There is amount of funding made available towards the purchase of Digital Technology equipment. There is strong support from the Board of Management in relation to this too.
- Many members of staff are highly trained and qualified in the area of Digital Technology and are happy to share their skills.
- Our pupils and parents are very eager and enthusiastic to developing digital learning within the whole school community.

### 2.4 This is what we are going to focus on to improve our digital learning practice further

- Parents and the whole school community become more aware of the range of ICT we are using in the school through updating a section on the school website. *This occurred at the start of the lockdown by the school communicating with the parents via Aladdin. Soon after every child in the school was given a Seesaw access code for online learning on Seesaw. The children have continued to use this going forward as an online e-Portfolio. From September 2020 Seesaw has been used online for homework at each class level. It is also used as a method to share classroom content with parents.*
- There will be class level sharing opportunities of ICT resources and ideas through Croke Park hours/staff meetings. *After we put this plan in place we had one physical staff meeting where we demonstrated the use of the new iPad trolley. Since then we have been meeting remotely via Zoom. Nevertheless, the sharing of ICT resources has still occurred between class levels. Class levels were encouraged to meet once a week online to share resources and ideas. Furthermore, Seesaw is still being employed as a method to share lessons and ideas amongst the whole school. A member of our teaching staff shared online setup and support videos for Seesaw for those who were unfamiliar with the platform.*
- Children will have access to a full complement of ICT initiatives within in the school through their eight year cycle. *Due to public health restrictions we were unable to use the digital technologies previously shared amongst classes. Instead we focused on each child becoming proficient users of the Seesaw and Zoom platforms at all levels from Junior Infants to 6<sup>th</sup> class. It was agreed amongst staff that use of the iPad trolley could still occur as it followed public health guidelines. Whilst the school building was open the trolley was made available to class levels at an allocated week in the school calendar.*
- *As a result of COVID-19 our digital technologies changed drastically. Therefore a new ICT Policy now named the Digital Technologies Policy (including Social Media) was drafted and published to reflect the school community as it is now. As with all policies this new policy is available to parents on the school website.*
